Over the decades, Gallet built a reputation as an international leader in fire, police and military helmets, leading to MSA Safety acquiring CGF Gallet of France in 2002. Today in Chatillon-sur-Chalaronne, MSA employs approximately 220 associates and manufactures structural fire helmets, wildland and rescue helmets, ballistic helmets, law enforcement helmets, aviation and helicopter helmets, and industrial helmets.
